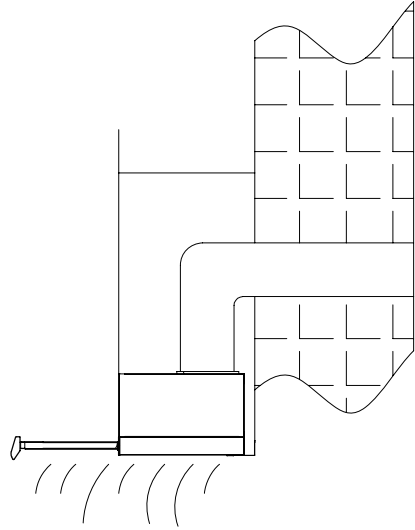




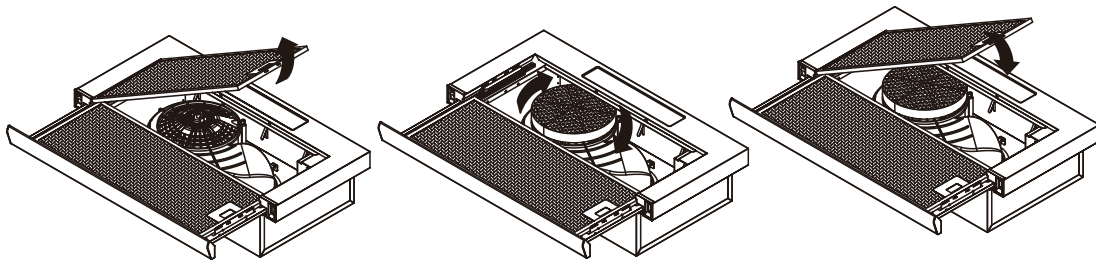


Note: The duct hole is off centre

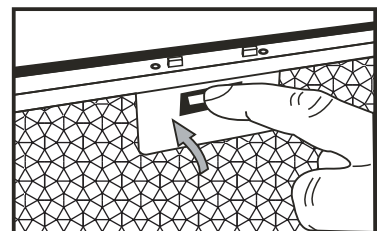
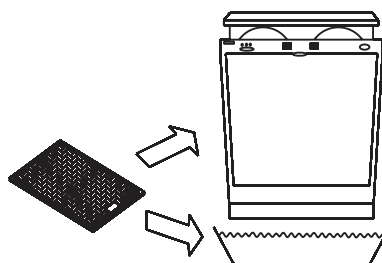
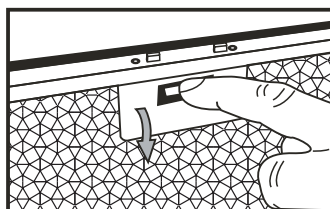
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Information and advice

CAUTION: Accessible parts may become hot when used with cooking appliances.

In certain circumstances electrical appliance may be a danger hazard.

- A) There must be adequate ventilation of the room when the cooker hood is used at the same time as appliances burning gas or other fuels.
- B) Do not check the status of the filters while the cooker hood is operating.
- C) Do not touch the light bulb within half an hour after appliance has been use.
- D) Do not flame under the range hood.
- E) Avoid opening gasometer when there is no pan on the stove, as it is damaging for the filters and a fire hazard.
- F) Constantly check food frying to avoid overheated oil splashing and becoming a fire hazard.
- G) Disconnect the electrical plug prior to any maintenance.
- H) Regulations concerning the discharge of air have to be fulfilled.
- I) When the range hood and appliances supplied with energy Other than electricity are simultaneously in operation. The negative pressure in the room must not exceed 4 Pa (4×10^{-5} bar)
- J) If the supply cord is damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, its service agent or similarly qualified persons in order to avoid a hazard.
- K) This appliance can be used by children aged from 8 years and above and persons with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities or lack of experience and knowledge if they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance in a safe way and understand the hazards involved. Children shall not play with the appliance. Cleaning and user maintenance shall not be made by children unless they are older than 8 and supervised.
- L) The range hood is intended to be installed over a hob having no more than four hob elements.
- M) Indoor use and household use only.
- N) When the appliance is not in use and before cleaning, unplug the appliance from the outlet.
- O) Attention ! Observe the warning in the instruction sheet concerning the operation of the appliance when air is discharged from the room.
- P) There is a fire risk if cleaning is not carried out in accordance with the instructions.
- Q) The air must not be discharged into a flue that is used for exhausting fumes from appliances burning gas or other fuels (not applicable to appliances that only discharge the air back into the room).
- R) Children should be supervised to ensure that they do not play with the appliance.
- S) Warning: Failure to install the screws or fixing device in accordance with these instructions may result in electrical hazards.
- T) The installation height of hood shall not be less than 60cm.
- U) The filter screen must be cleaned regularly, otherwise there is a danger of fire.
- V) The installation must be carried out according to the screws and positions required by the instructions, which will easily damage the connecting wires.
- W) Range hoods and other cooking fume extractors may adversely affect the safe operation of appliances burning gas or other fuels (including those in other rooms) due to back flow of combustion gases. These gases can potentially result in carbon monoxide poisoning. After installation of a range hood or other cooking fume extractor, the operation of flued gas appliances should be tested by a competent person to ensure that back flow of combustion gases does not occur.

Information and advice

Information: Congratulations on the purchase of our cooker hood which is designed to include many superior features.

Before installing and using the hood carefully read all the instructions.

Caution: Turn the power off before starting installation.

- Remove the hood from the carton and remove all packaging materials. Lay it on a padded / protected surface to prevent damage.

Check the voltage and frequency on the rating label inside the hood comply with local standards (Fig.2).

- Install the hood no less than 600mm and no more than 750mm above the cooking surface (Fig.3).

Selection of venting or recirculation mode

- Ducted mode. Insert the big block into the position as per Fig. 4 (a). Keep the small handle rail installed on the hood.

- Recirculation mode. Insert the small block into the position as per Fig. 5 (a). Remove the small handle rail and attach the larger handle rail.

Caution: The air must not be discharged into a duct/flue that is used for exhausting fumes from any other appliances.

Installation

Ensure the power has been turned off before beginning this installation.

- Ducted mode:

Remove the knockout (as per Fig 6) using a flat head screwdriver inserted under one end and gently lever it up. Cut the attachment points using tin snips and remove. Screw the damper flap onto the hood as shown.

- Recirculation mode:

Leave the knockout in place Remove the tape from the vents.

Caution: Know where the electrical wiring and other utilities are located behind walls before cutting or drilling into walls or ceilings.

You will need 2 people to install the hood.

Keep the power cord and plug accessible for easy access to the power socket.

Ducting mode: Ensure the hole for the damper flap & duct has been cut in the cabinet.

1. Using the template supplied mark the screw locations in the cabinet. Note: the gap between the rear wall and the hood should not be more than 10mm.

2. Drill 4 x 7mm holes as marked using the template.

3. Make sure the opening in the hood aligns with the ductwork.

4. Put the screws into the expanding plugs (supplied) into the holes
5. Hold the hood in place and screw down until the hood is secured. Check there is no space between the top of the hood and the cabinet.

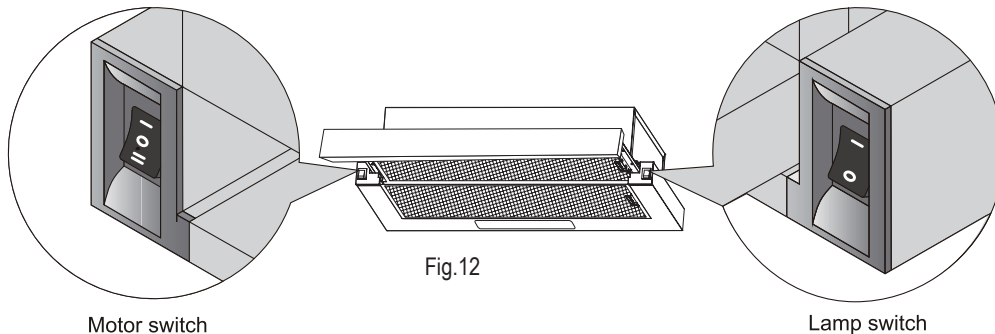
Caution: Installation work and electrical wiring must be done by qualified person(s) in accordance with all applicable laws, regulations and safety standards.

Caution: The hood should be power OFF.

Ducted mode as per Fig. 8 and 9

- Connect the hose (not supplied) to the damper flap and place the duct hose into position (Fig.8).
- Plug in the appliance when it is fully installed (Fig.9).

Information: The air must not be discharged into a flue that is used for exhausting fumes from appliances burning gas or other fuels.



To use

Pull out the telescopic hood using the handle rail. You will hear a click when it is in place. No click, no power, this is the safety switch.

Select the motor speed, using the switch on the front of the hood. (0 is off, I is low speed and II is high speed)

Using the other switch on the front of the hood. (0 is off, I is on)

To turn off

Select motor speed 0.

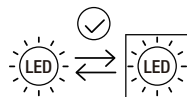
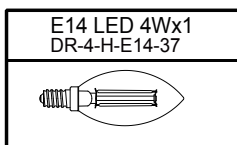
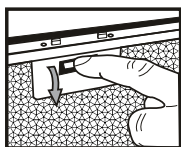
Turn off the light

Push the telescopic piece back into the hood.

Information: Do not touch the light bulb within half an hour after appliance use. The lamp shall not be covered with thermal insulation or other material.

Cleaning and maintenance instructions

Caution: Turn off the hood before cleaning.



Replaceable (LED only) light source by an end-user

Caution: Wait 30 minutes for the light bulb to cool down after using the hood. It is hot and may burn!

Open the filter, Remove the old light bulb. Replace with a new lightbulb.

Information: Clean the filters at least once every 3 months.

Cleaning instructions

1. Clean the surface of the hood frequently using mild soap or detergent.
2. Avoid the use of harsh cleaning agents as it may spoil the hood's appearance.
3. Wash the filters using mild soap or detergent. The filters can be cleaned in a dishwasher.
- Note that heavy grease build up may not be able to be cleaned and the filters should be replaced (Fig.11).
4. Never clean the charcoal filters. They must be replaced as necessary (Fig.10).

Information: Never let water enter the motor or electrical parts as this may cause an electric shock hazard.

- Pierce foods with heavy skins such as potatoes, whole squashes, apples and chestnuts before cooking.
- Utensils should be checked to ensure that they are suitable for use in microwave oven.

2. WHAT IS NOT COVERED BY THE WARRANTY.

The Warranty does not apply if an Artusi product is defective by a factor other than a defect arising in the manufacture of the Artusi product, including but not limited to:

- (a) damage through misuse (including failure to maintain, service or use with proper care), neglect, accident or ordinary wear and tear (including deterioration of parts and accessories and glass breakage);

The Warranty does not extend to light globes used in Artusi products.

3. DOMESTIC USE

Each Artusi product is made for domestic use. This Warranty may not extend to Artusi products used for commercial purposes.

4. TIME FOR CLAIM UNDER THE WARRANTY

You must make any claim under this Warranty within twenty eight (28) days after the occurrence of an event which gives rise to a claim pursuant to the Warranty, by booking a service call on the telephone number below.

5. PROOF OF PURCHASE

Customers must retain proof of purchase in order to be eligible to make a warranty claim in respect of an Artusi product.

6. CLAIMING UNDER THE WARRANTY
